Brooks Pierce attorney Will Quick has been selected as one of the American Bar Association's 2019 On the Rise – Top 40 Young Lawyers. This award recognizes attorneys who are visionaries and leaders, both professionally and in their community, who are members of the American Bar Association and are 36 years of age or younger or received their law license within the last five years. The award will be presented at the American Bar Association's annual meeting in San Francisco on August 10.
