The State Judicial Council is an advisory and oversight body for the Judicial Branch. The council's membership consists of representatives from every component of the court system, members of the bar and the public. Members are tasked with advising both the Chief Justice and the General Assembly on proper funding and administration for North Carolina's state courts.
