Bill McDonough, co-author of *Cradle to Cradle* and a thought leader on sustainability, spoke recently at the UNC Kenan-Flagler Business School. The title of his talk was "Cradle to Cradle's Triple Top Line: Growing the Economy, the Ecology and Social Revenues." He said that we and those who come after us can have a world of abundance, not limits, if we remake the way we make things. For McDonough, it's a question of design. He advocated using a radically different approach to designing and producing the objects we use and enjoy, from chemicals to energy to communities. Nature's design principles are at the heart of McDonough's approach. He said the pursuit of the abundance and hope that sustainability promises is a global matter that depends on local action.
